DMCA COPYRIGHT INFRINGEMENT POLICY

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Silicon Harbor Technologies, LLC complies with the Digital Millennium Copyright Act (DMCA) and responds promptly to valid copyright infringement notices. This policy outlines the procedures for reporting alleged copyright infringement on the Enovari platform.

1. Designated DMCA Agent

All copyright infringement notices should be sent to Silicon Harbor's designated DMCA agent:

2. Filing a DMCA Notice

To file a valid DMCA takedown notice, you must provide a written communication that includes ALL of the following elements:

1. **Identification of the copyrighted work:** Describe the copyrighted work you claim has been infringed. If multiple works are covered by a single notification, provide a representative list.
2. **Identification of the infringing material:** Provide sufficient detail to locate the material on Enovari (e.g., project URL, repository name, file path, or screenshot).
3. **Contact information:** Your name, address, telephone number, and email address.
4. **Good faith statement:** Include the following: "I have a good faith belief that use of the copyrighted material described above is not authorized by the copyright owner, its agent, or the law."
5. **Accuracy statement under penalty of perjury:** Include the following: "I swear, under penalty of perjury, that the information in this notification is accurate and that I am the copyright owner or authorized to act on behalf of the copyright owner."
6. **Physical or electronic signature:** Sign the notice with a physical or electronic signature.

Incomplete notices will not be processed. Please ensure all required elements are included.

3. Processing DMCA Notices

Upon receipt of a valid DMCA notice, Silicon Harbor will:

- Remove or disable access to the allegedly infringing material within 24-72 hours
- Notify the user who uploaded the material of the takedown and provide a copy of the notice
- Inform the user of their right to file a counter-notification (see Section 4)
- Terminate accounts of repeat infringers in appropriate circumstances

4. Filing a DMCA Counter-Notification

If you believe your content was removed in error or that you have the right to use the material, you may file a counter-notification that includes:

7. **Identification of the removed material:** Describe the material that was removed and where it appeared before removal.
8. **Contact information:** Your name, address, telephone number, and email address.
9. **Good faith statement:** Include the following: "I swear, under penalty of perjury, that I have a good faith belief that the material was removed or disabled as a result of mistake or misidentification."
10. **Consent to jurisdiction:** Include the following: "I consent to the jurisdiction of the Federal District Court for the judicial district in which my address is located (or the District of South Carolina if outside the United States), and I will accept service of process from the person who provided the original DMCA notice or an agent of such person."
11. **Physical or electronic signature:** Sign the counter-notification with a physical or electronic signature.

5. Processing Counter-Notifications

Upon receipt of a valid counter-notification, Silicon Harbor will:

- Forward a copy of the counter-notification to the original complainant
- Inform the complainant that the removed material will be restored in 10-14 business days
- Restore the material within 10-14 business days UNLESS the complainant files a court action seeking an injunction

6. Repeat Infringer Policy

Silicon Harbor maintains a repeat infringer policy in accordance with DMCA requirements:

- Users who receive multiple valid DMCA notices will be flagged for review
- Accounts with three or more valid infringement claims may be suspended or terminated
- Users who submit fraudulent DMCA notices or counter-notifications may also face termination

7. Misrepresentation & Penalties

Under 17 U.S.C. § 512(f), any person who knowingly materially misrepresents that:

- Material or activity is infringing, OR
- Material was removed or disabled by mistake or misidentification

...shall be liable for damages, including costs and attorneys' fees, incurred by the alleged infringer or copyright owner as a result of Silicon Harbor relying upon such misrepresentation.

8. Limitations & Disclaimers

- Silicon Harbor does not manually review all user-uploaded content for copyright compliance
- Users are solely responsible for ensuring they have rights to upload and process code
- This policy applies only to copyright claims; trademark or patent disputes require separate processes
- Silicon Harbor reserves the right to remove content for reasons beyond DMCA compliance (e.g., AUP violations)
